



Inspiring literacy and imagination in our young students


Carey's libraries provide students with a wonderful place to engage with reading, build imagination and inspire creativity, while also developing important literacy skills.

Investing in student wellbeing, physical education and sport

Just over a year ago, Carey acquired the former MCC Kew Heights Bowling Club and began the process of transforming the site into purpose-built wellbeing, physical education and sporting facility for students.

With your support, we are excited to begin the next stage of this major project and redevelop the old lawn bowl greens into modern multi-use sporting pitches for physical education classes, wellbeing programs, APS tennis and netball training and competition. The pitches may also be used in the future for hockey and soccer training.

This project will provide considerable long-term benefits for Carey students. It is well known that physical activity is essential for healthy growth and development, as well as the maintenance of positive mental health.

Research has shown that regular physical activity is also important to learning and academic performance, improving concentration and attention, and enhancing classroom attitudes and behaviours.
